Keynote Speaker: "Tales from the Zooniverse: Innovation Leading to Discovery" with Dr. Laura Trouille Feb. 20 | 12 p.m.- 1p.m. | Zoom

The Zooniverse is the world's largest platform for people-powered research, engaging more than 2.5 million people in over 100 projects, from tagging animals in camera trap images to marking cell structures for cancer research to transcribing historical documents to discovering planets around distant stars. Processing our increasingly large datasets poses a bottleneck for producing real scientific outcomes and citizen science - engaging the public in research - provides a solution, particularly when coupled with automated routines. Through this talk we'll explore the key decision points that led to innovation and pushing boundaries in this space, and highlight a few of the stories of discovery.

Dr. Laura Trouille is vice president of Science Engagement and Visualization at the Adler Planetarium in Chicago, Illinois and co-primary investigator to Zooniverse. Participants must pre-register to get access to the Zoom link.
