

LIVING LEARNING COMMUNITY

The **LEAD Scholars Living Learning Community** (LLC), located in the Neptune Community, is for first-year students who are a part of the LEAD Scholars Academy. LLC accommodations include: single room housing with a shared bathroom with one other resident and a community room with kitchen on each floor.

CLASS PROJECT TURNED RSO: HOW BOOKS MAKE AN IMPACT ON LEAD SCHOLARS AND OTHERS

tudents in the LDR 2001 class are split up into groups based on what they are passionate about; one group formed because of their shared value of education's importance. They went on to create Book Shacks, becoming an RSO in late March in order to create a more sustainable organization for future students.

The mission of Book Shacks is to encourage students to read by making books more attainable and accessible. The RSO put up multiple Book Shacks in high traffic areas of UCF including the Writing Center, the Burnett Honors College, the LEAD Lounge, the Creative School for Children, and the Student Union.

The members of Book Shacks believe that recreational reading is important; by setting up the Book Shacks with free books, it becomes much easier to access recreational reading materials. Each Book Shack can contain 40–60 books of various genres. Alongside the books, bookmarks from Book Shacks are found with a reminder to leave a book when a book is taken from the Book Shack.

Book Shacks holds service days in order to build and maintain the Book Shacks around campus. They also hold social events, like poetry slams and literature Jeopardy, in order to get more people involved in topics such as humanities.

This organization has brought accessibility to books for students and experience in leadership. LEAD Scholar Erin Fuchs says she learned many professional skills because of her participation in Book Shacks, such as planning and hosting events, and improving her writing skills. She also learned soft skills in collaboration with other members of the RSO.

According to Fuchs, "As leaders, it is our responsibility to serve our community."

She and her group saw the impact their idea had on campus.

"In forming the Book Shacks, I think that each of [the members] have grown both as individuals and as leaders," said Fuchs.

The members of Book Shacks plan on expanding the location of the libraries even further in UCF, and possibly to other schools in Florida.
